f. Page Unified School District Superintendent, Bryce Anderson All Data indicators show that PUSD will be a Grade B for 2026. All improvements have been removed. Vocabulary is a big focus and the school walls have Vocabulary that children need to know. Vocabulary and Reading are critical. The students are growing and moving. A main focus is to ensure safety for the children. October 16, decommission outdated tower, update Fiber Optic to Navajo Mountain to allow consistent communication between bus drivers and Page. Working on adding an additional classroom to Page Preschool, to help meet children enrollment needs (enroll your young children now). 4 new buses will be added to the fleet, air conditioning was added to every route this year. Three electric buses are being added to the fleet, this is a significantly lower cost than traditional buses. High School has an incentivised lunch, this allows the children to earn off campus lunch. (Criteria has to be met to earn this priviledge.) Looking for areas of improvements, and going to work on these areas as they are identified. Over the summer, an overflow parking was built for school events, this is located to the southwest of Desert View. Started to add fencing to fully secure the High School.

Question: 8th grade and 9th grade are eating together, children do not have enough time to sit and eat and not enough places to eat.

Answer: Going to add a grab and go lunch to make the process quicker for children.

Question: how can we ease the concession stand time to eliminate missing parts of games/events.

Answer: working on finding a solution through possible runners with food, however, the soda machines are not effective. Looking at having 3 concessions places total. Working to improve.

Recommendation: add more registers.

Statement: phonelines are not being answered at Desert View or Lake View.

Superintendent Anderson will follow up.
